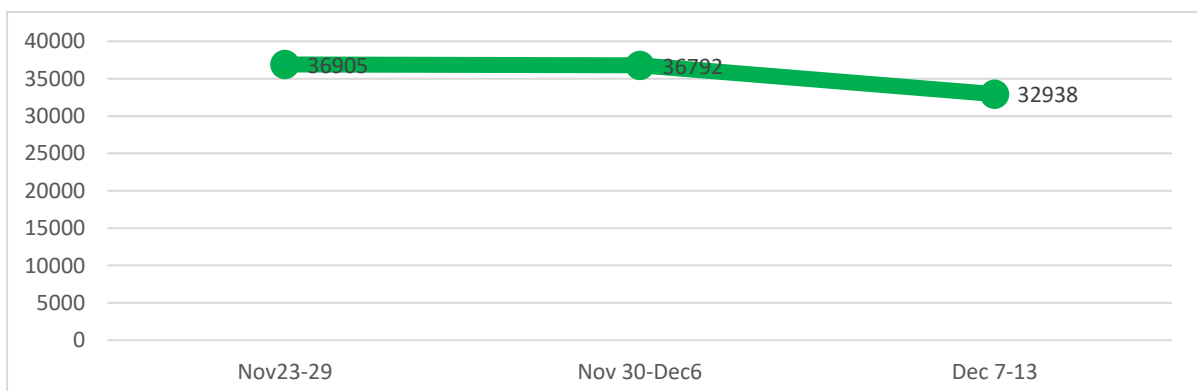

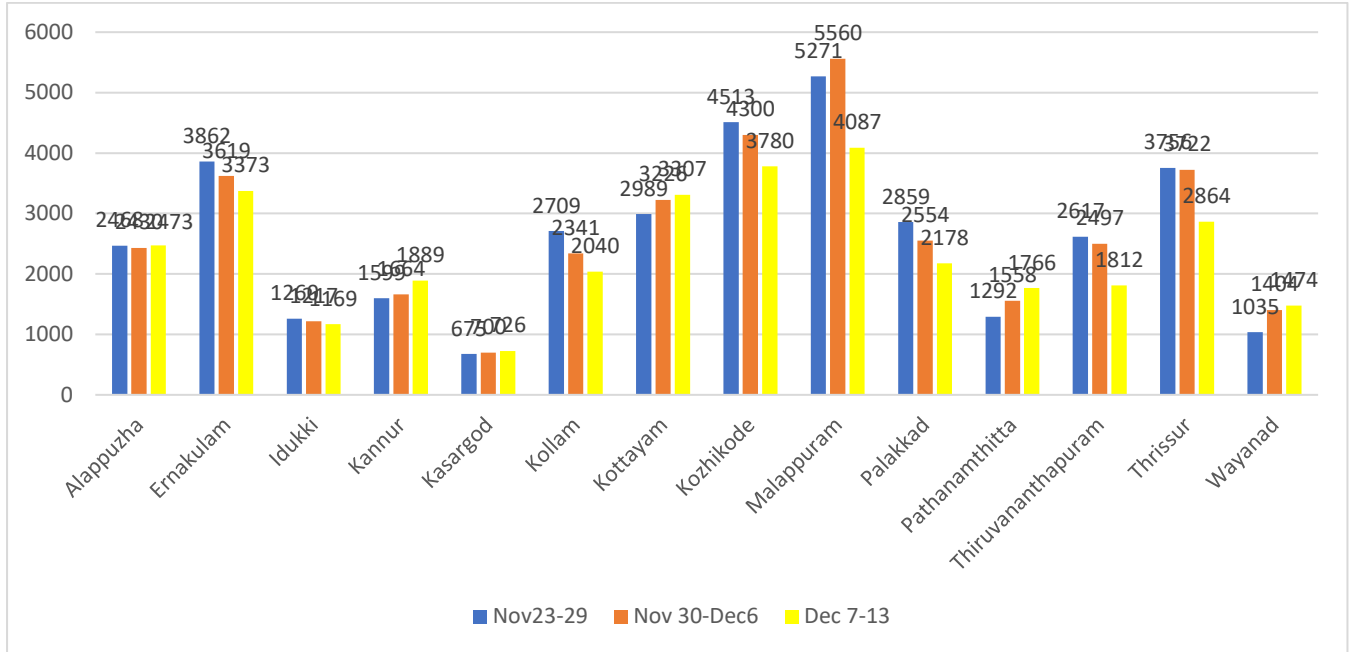

Absolute number of new cases reported per week in Kerala



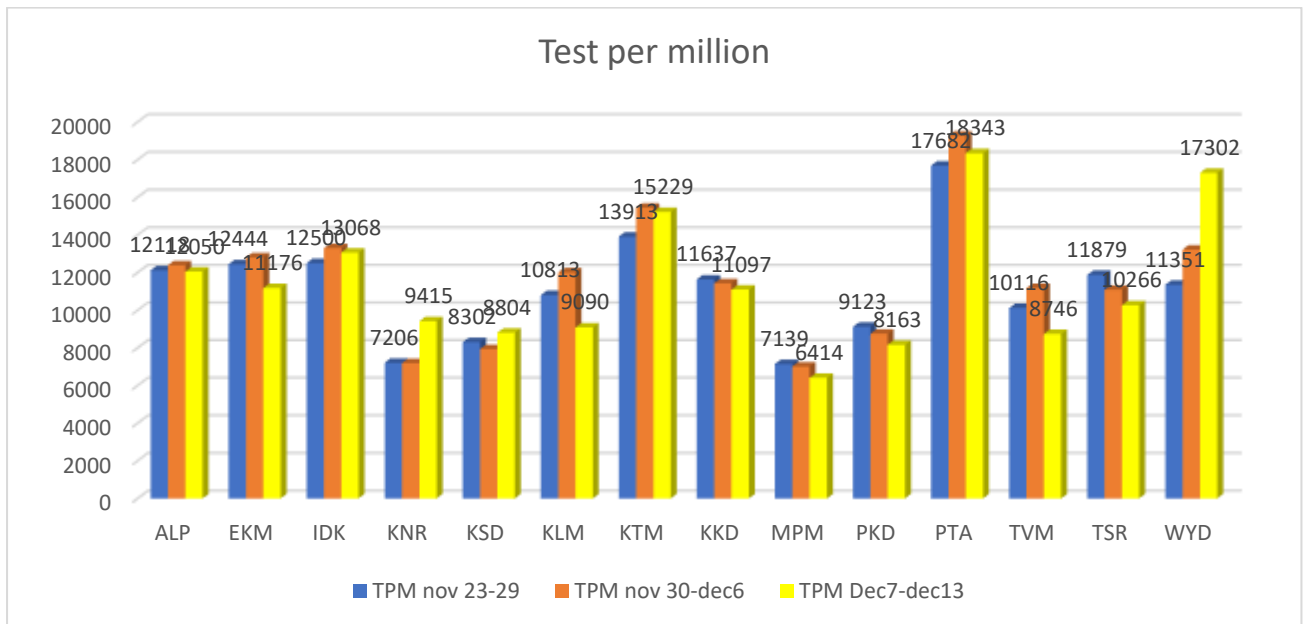


Absolute Number of new Cases reported per week



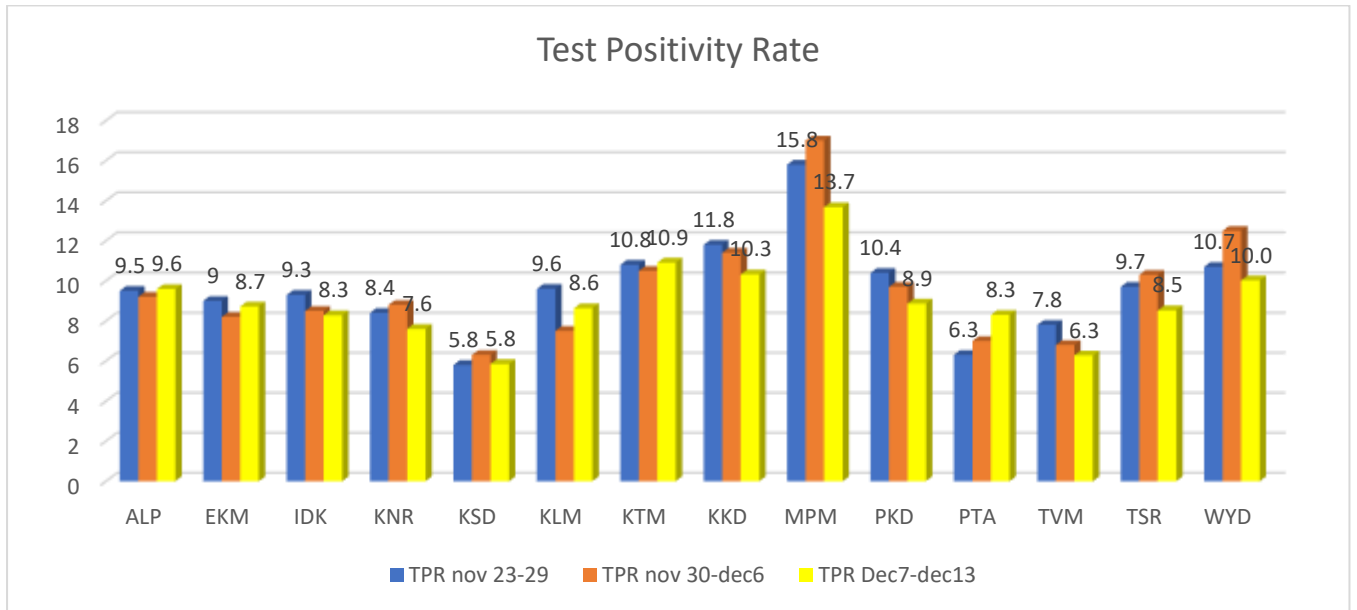
Absolute number of new cases reported per week are on increasing trend in Pathanamthitta, Wayanad, Kottayam and Kannur.

Tests per Million- Weekly data (7 days)

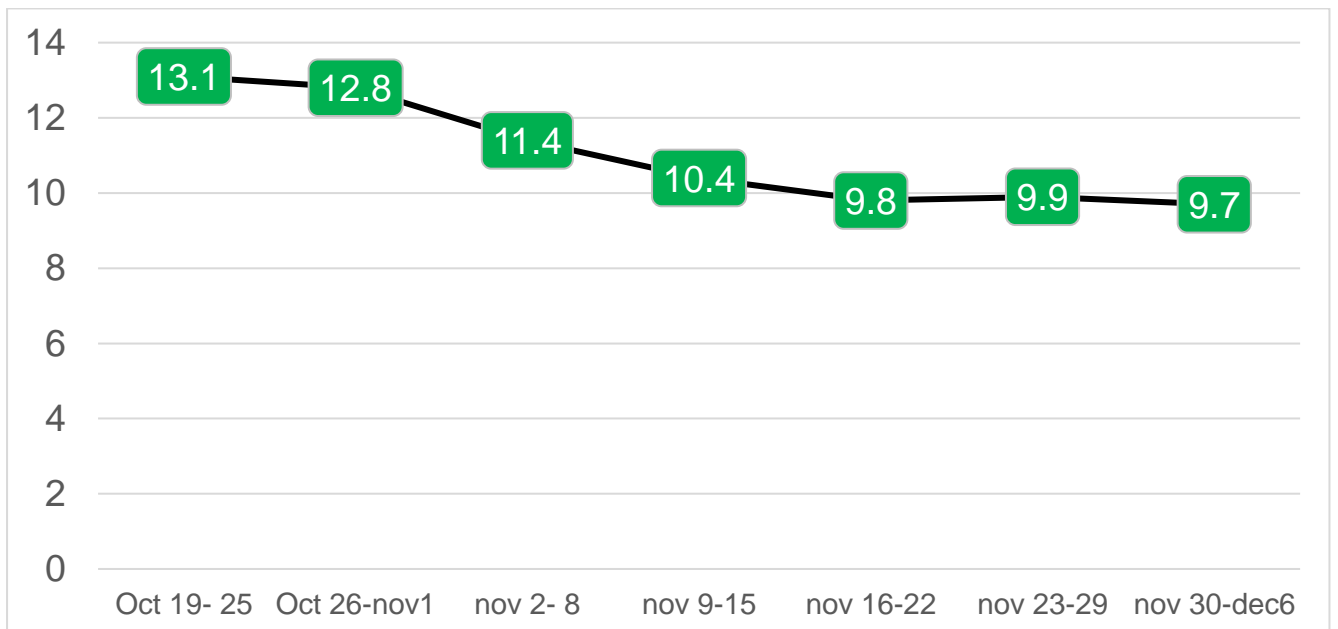




Test Positivity Rate- Weekly data
